The event repeats itself building on the positive impressions of the first edition, with many people that were seen strolling around the city with the programme in hand and the desire to discover the hidden green beauties of our city.

We are delighted to invite our fellow citizens first and then all fans of life outdoors at the second edition of the event, which we have tried to enrich with even more pleasant places to discover and interesting cultural events. This time almost fifty gardens magically open their doors to the public, thanks to the courtesy and availability of the owners, who show with legitimate pride the beauty of which they are both architects and guardians, unveiling new views of our city. In addition to the gardens, we are pleased to include prestigious events, such as the refined "Rossini" concerts of the Teatro Comunale of Bologna or the evocative readings that Coop Adriatica proposes with its "Ad Alta Voce" (Speaking Aloud), not to mention the exhibitions, other musical instances, conferences and meetings that will enrich the programme of this feast for the eyes lasting three days. We are particularly pleased to host the organizer of a similar event in Amsterdam, which we take as a good omen for a European network that is in its infancy.

We ask visitors, as occurred admirably in the first edition, to enter on tiptoe in these places which open their doors with politeness and availability to be visited. As for the rest, we hope that the weather is fine and that all will be satisfied.

IN THE HISTORICAL CENTRE

- 1 **Via Inrerio 42, Orto Botanico (Botanical Gardens), Saturday h 8.30-13** The charming botanical gardens of Bologna for the event will offer a guided tour and some meetings on "green" topics (see events).
- 2 **Via del Borgo di San Pietro 1/c, Palazzo Bentivoglio, Saturday h 10-13 and h 15-19** A small hidden garden, with three monumental trees, reinvented by a fine restoration. The interior can be visited organized by ADSI.
- 3 **Via Belle Arti 25, Casa Grande Pollicini, Friday h 15-19, Saturday h 10-13** A small, lush garden with palm trees, banana trees and evergreens, dominated by a fine example of a plane tree and surrounded by ancient walls.
- 4 **Via Belle Arti 50, Friday h 15-19** A small portion of an old and vast cultivated area, intentionally wild, surrounded by a wall of the seventeenth century.
- 5 **Via Zamboni 53, Palazzo Tornani, Friday h 15-19, Saturday h 10-13 and h 15-19** The study of the artist Anna Girolomini leads to this particular inner garden, in a building which was originally a convent and a hospital for pilgrims. Friday h 19, aperitif in the garden organized by La pentola che bolle® (5 euros).
- 6 **Largo Respighi, Giardino del Guasto, Friday h 16-19, Saturday h 10-13 and h 16-19** The beautiful contemporary garden was created in 1975 on a part of the ruins of palazzo dei Bentivoglio.
- 7 **Via Quadri 6, Friday h 15-19** A precious and romantic inner garden, with a well, cypress, loquat tree and charming details.
- 8 **Via Quadri 6, Friday h 15-19** A small second garden, confining with the former, with a remarkable view on a portion of the historical city.
- 9 **Via Begatto 9, Villa Lipparini, Friday h 15-19, Saturday h 10-19, Sunday h 10-19** The garden of a villa in the centre of Bologna, with two fountains and some beautiful trees, which is also a focal point of the event. Always open to provide information and catering to visitors. Snacks provided by ZOO. Specialized library corner organized by Librerie Coop.
- 10 **Vicolo Bolognetti 18, Friday h 15-19, Saturday h 10-13 and h 15-19, Sunday h 10-13 and h 15-19** Large garden, attributable to Strada Maggiore 54, with towering trees and statues in cement.
- 11 **Strada Maggiore 46, Palazzo Bolognetti, Friday h 15-19, Saturday h 10-13** A fascinating entrance and a garden with statues in cement and fountain.
- 12 **Strada Maggiore 34, Palazzo Sanguineti, Saturday h 10-18.30, Sunday h 10-18.30** The inner garden of the Music Museum, with banana trees and trompe-l'oeil dating to the nineteenth century.
- 13 **Strada Maggiore 45, Palazzo Hercolani, Friday h 15-19, Saturday h 10-13 and h 15-19, Sunday h 10-13 and h 15-19** A university location, enriched by the wonderful Woodland room, which houses a green corner with grotto and ice-house.
- 14 **Via San Vitale 94, Friday h 15-19, Saturday h 10-13 and h 15-19, Sunday h 10-13 and h 15-19** The charming and cosy inner garden of the hotel San Vitale.
- 15 **Via Broccaindosso 20, Saturday h 10-13** The garden which still houses the famous pomegranate that inspired Giosuè Carducci.
- 16 **Vicolo Malgrado 3/2, Saturday h 10-13 and h 15-19, Sunday h 10-13 and h 15-19** The garden of Fondazione Zucchelli, with roses and other plants with a flavour of times gone by.
- 17 **Via Fondazza 36, Giardino di Casa Morandi, Friday h 15-19, Saturday h 10-19, Sunday h 10-19** The small garden that inspired many of the paintings by Giorgio Morandi.
- 18 **Piazza Carducci 5, Giardino di Casa Carducci, Saturday h 10 and h 11.30, guided tours, limited number** The garden-monument near the last home of the poet. Guided tours by Simonetta Santucci, director of the Museo Carducci (Carducci Museum). During the morning, free entrance to the Musei Carducci and del Risorgimento.
- 19 **Via Santo Stefano 75, Palazzo Agucchi, Friday h 15-19, Saturday h 10-13** A magnificent Italian-style garden with statues, fountains and pavilions.
- 20 **Via Santo Stefano 63, Palazzo Rosselli del Turco, Friday h 15-19, Saturday h 10-13 and h 15-19, Sunday h 10-13 and h 15-19** A spacious garden with a fountain and centenary cedar of Lebanon.
- 21 **Via Santo Stefano 57, Casa Varrini, Friday h 15-19, Saturday h 10-13 and h 15-19, Sunday h 10-13 and h 15-19** Olive trees, palm trees and a majestic Himalayan cedar in a garden which stands above the magnificent entrance hallway.
- 22 **Via Santo Stefano 56, Palazzo Zani, Friday h 15-19, Saturday h 15-19, Sunday h 15-19** At the back of the sixteenth-century palace, headquarters of the Rhenish Reclamation, stand reminiscences of the romantic garden and of neo-Gothic details, such as the shrine at the top of the ice-house.
- 23 **Via Santo Stefano 30, Palazzo Hercolani-Bonora, Friday h 15-19, Saturday h 10-13** A garden subdivided into two inner courtyards, rich in botanical essences and allegorical statues.
- 24 **Via Castiglione 29, Palazzo Ratta-Pizzardi Friday entrances h 15, 15.30, 16, 16.30, 17, 17.30; guided tours by Stefano Monti, Historical-Artistic Heritage Office, AUSL Bologna.** In the headquarters of the AUSL of Bologna, a pleasant garden at the rear of the church of San Domenico, which was once part of the convent gardens.
- 25 **Via Quadri 42, Friday h 15-19** A charming inner courtyard, with a well and a statue, that is gradually being enriched with plants.

- 26 **Via della Braina 11, Orti di Orfeo, Sunday h 10.30-12.30** The renowned vegetable-ornamental gardens of the former convent of Santa Maria della Vittoria: a corner of countryside in the city. Starting from h 13 lunch at the gardens organized by trattoria Scaccomatto (reservation is compulsory: 051 263404).
- 27 **Via Garibaldi 3, Palazzo Barbazzi, Friday h 15-19, Saturday h 10-13** The frescoed lodges of the palace overlook on the garden courtyard, with a fountain characterized by a double basin and cherubs.
- 28 **Via Savenella 11, Saturday h 15-19, Sunday h 10-13 and h 15-19** An old vegetable-ornamental Bolognese garden, with both wild and cultivated plants, regains strength within the green area of a historical city block.
- 29 **Via Savenella 13, Saturday h 15-19, Sunday h 10-13 and h 15-19** A seventeenth-century building, which has kept the scenic setting of its garden with kiosk and architectural backdrop, presently houses the association Reuse with Love, which provides free bicycles to cycle through the gardens.
- 30 **Via Savenella 19, Saturday h 10-13 and h 15-19, Sunday h 10-13 and h 15-19** Another small green area, once used for productive and service purposes, which has preserved the atmosphere of Bologna in times gone by.
- 31 **Via Solferino 11, Casa Moreschi, Sunday h 10-13 and h 15-19** A garden, partly of Italian style, enclosed by a crenellated wall with pictorial backdrop and small grotto.
- 32 **Via Solferino 19, Villa Lipparini, Friday h 16-19.30, Saturday h 16-19.30, Sunday h 16-19.30** Small "scrambly" garden in the head office of the association duepuntilab.
- 33 **Piazza di Porta Saragozza 4, Villino Giulia, Saturday h 15-19** An elegant garden with a fountain and sculptures, enriched by a centenary rose garden and a group of ancient yews.
- 34 **Via Saragozza 26, Palazzo Albergati, Friday h 15-19, Saturday h 10-13** The greenery of the urban residence of a famous family where the Roman baths once stood.
- 35 **Via Cà Selvatica 4, Casa Masetti Zannini, Friday h 15-19, Saturday h 10-13 and h 15-19, Sunday h 10-13 and h 15-19** The spacious garden, also called "ornithological", where the vegetable gardens of the convent of Santa Maria degli Angeli once developed.
- 36 **Via Cà Selvatica 4, Casa Masetti Zannini, Friday h 15-19, Saturday h 10-13 and h 15-19, Sunday h 10-13 and h 15-19** A smaller portion of the same area, whose access is again from the courtyard of the stables.
- 37 **Via Pietralata 16, Friday h 15-19, Saturday h 10-13 and h 15-19, Sunday h 10-13 and h 15-19** A real treat in full historical centre, with refined antique furniture, climbing roses and bushes of boxwood.
- 38 **Via San Felice 40, Friday h 15-19, Saturday h 10-13 and h 15-19, Sunday h 10-13 and h 15-19** The Vegetable gardens of San Felice are a striking backdrop for events, while in the past centuries they were part of a large cultivated plot between via del Pratello and San Felice.

OUT OF TOWN (NEARBY HILLSIDES)

- 39 **Via dell'Osservanza 19, Villa Baruzziana, Saturday entrances h 15 (concert at h 16) and h 17.30, Sunday entrances h 16 and h 17.30** The park of the clinic, former residence of a famous sculptor, with its magnificent view of the city.
- 40 **Via dell'Osservanza 41, Villa Scarani, Sunday entrances, with oil tasting, h 16 and h 17.30** The olive grove of the farm Scarani, at the back of the villa, with a superb view of the city.
- 41 **Via dei Colli, Giardino di Rose (Rose garden) of the farm Le Vigne, Saturday h 10-13 and h 15-19; with shuttle bus.** A beautiful rose garden on a strip of cultivated hillside, with many varieties of old roses.
- 42 **Piazzale Bacchelli 4, Villa Revedin, Sunday entrances h 10, 11, 12 and 15, 16, 17, 18** The extensive grounds of the archdiocesan seminary, near San Michele in Bosco, full of fascinating sights.
- 43 **Via degli Scalini 18, Villa Guastavillani, Friday h 19.30 (at h 20.30 "Ad Alta Voce", see events), Saturday entrances h 10, 11.30, 15, 16.30, 18** Friday entrance is exclusively with shuttle bus, reservation is compulsory (051 3399084). Saturday entrance is with shuttle bus and bus 59. The park of the sixteenth-century villa, now location of the university, with the secret garden and the grotto of the Nymph.
- 44 **Via Molinelli 22, Villa Belpoggio Hercolani, Sunday entrances h 10, 11, 12 Bus 16 (Hercolani stop).** The large park of late 1700s, with staircases, terraces, slopes and large tree specimens, which makes a stunning backdrop to the monumental villa.
- 45 **Via Siepelunga 57, Villa Pelliccioni, Saturday h 15-19, Sunday h 10-13 entrances every 30 min.** Bus 16 (Siepelunga stop). The park of a villa, designed by Angelo Venturoli, offering great views of the city.

OUT OF TOWN (LOWLANDS)

- 46 **Via San Donato 197, Villa Clelia, Saturday entrances h 10, 11, 12 Bus 93 (Menarini stop).** An English-style romantic park, with brook, small lake and ruins along the historical via San Donato.
- 47 **Via San Donato 198/200, Villa Armandi Avogli Trotti, Saturday entrances h 10, 11, 12 Bus 93 (San Sisto stop).** At h 12 conversation in the garden with the historian Anna Maria Matteucci. A sequence of magnificent tree species, mostly exotic, lead to a modern building, with a nineteenth-century oval room that refers to Letizia Murat Pepoli.
- 48 **Via del Gomito 7, IIPLE, giardino delle Ninfee, Saturday h 10-13 (at h 11 conference presentation, see events).** Bus 25 (Gomito stop). A tiny and original garden with water features, bamboo, wall paintings and ceramic sculptures in the location of the Professional Education of Construction Workers Institute of Bologna and Province.

How to participate

Diverdeinverde will take place starting from the afternoon of Friday 22 till Sunday 24 May. A nominal entrance ticket (Euro 10) gives you the right to access the private gardens included in the programme during the three days of the event; the programme also includes a few public green areas with free access. The days and opening hours of each garden are as indicated in the programme. All the events are free of charge.

Cautions

Diverdeinverde will take place regularly even with bad weather. Not all gardens are open for the duration of the event; in some gardens, in addition, entrance is allowed only in specific times and with guided tours. We recommend you check times and modalities before planning visits. The entrance ticket is nominal and must be accompanied by an identity card. Children under 12 years old have free access. The entrance ticket allows to visit all the gardens during the three days of the event. Most of the gardens unfortunately are not accessible with wheelchairs. Two of the gardens in the hillsides are accessible only by shuttle bus and there are no car parks in the proximity, as is the case for the other gardens out of town; the more sporty, of course, can reach the parks by bicycle or on foot. The volunteer ecology wardens of Bologna, supported by university students, control the access to the gardens and the correct behaviour of the visitors. The most important acknowledgement goes to the owners who, with great generosity and at no charge, joined the event by opening their gardens to visitors. Special thanks to the organizations, companies, associations and to the many friends who, in various ways, have given us a helping hand to prepare and perform the event. The Risorgimento, Carducci and Morandi Museums deserve a special mention for their collaboration and entrance free of charge in conjunction with the event, as well as associated Confcommercio – ASCOM book stores, which will dedicate their shop windows to gardens and landscape during the week of the event, and FAI (Italian National Trust) and ADSI (Italian Historic Houses Association) that have favoured the opening of the gardens to their associates.
